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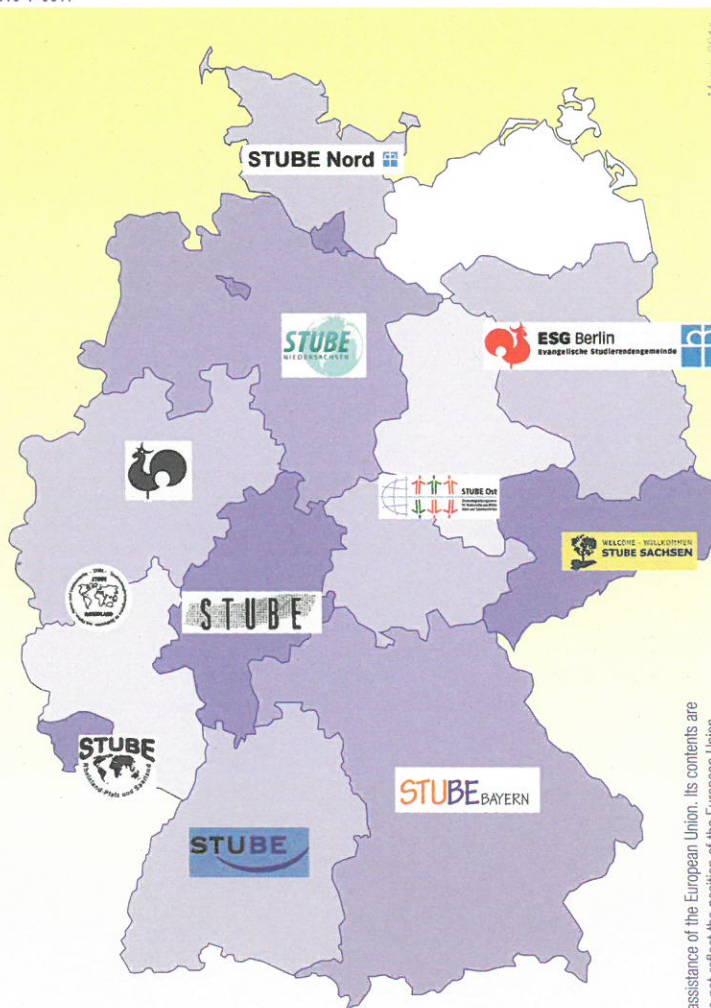

Foreign Students in Germany

3/4 of the approx. 230.000 foreign students in Germany come from developing and newly industrialized countries. They make a hugely positive contribution to the internationalization of German further education.

Foreign graduates enrich the German labour market with their expertise. They are the much needed specialists of the future in their native countries, and act as excellent bridge-builders between their own and other countries.

85% of these students pay their own way for their studies. They are so-called "freemovers". They receive neither a scholarship nor do they participate in other specific support programmes.

In order to find their feet in German university life and day-to-day culture, to integrate socially and to orient their studies to development policy, students from Africa, Asia and Latin America rely on special orientation programmes.

The Development Education Programme STUBE (Studienbegleitprogramm) offers these students a forum in which they can share experiences and development-related information. It commences at the start of the course of studies and accompanies the students throughout its duration. STUBE encourages discussion on topics such as sustainable education and development, as well as personal career planning. A tie to the native country is maintained throughout.

Development Education Programme STUBE

The Development Education Programme STUBE for students from Africa, Asia and Latin America is available in eleven states/regions within Germany. STUBE is financed through the German protestant church and public funds.

STUBE supplements individual study with high-quality extra-curricular activities, which help the students to develop an awareness of, and gain competence in development issues.

STUBE features:

- Intercultural, interdisciplinary and interreligious orientation
- Student participation
- Immediate and continual student support
- Cooperation with universities, university Christian groups, development-related political and intercultural initiatives and organisations
- Reality-oriented discussions of theory and practice; support of students in gearing their studies to the needs of their native country
- Promotion of South-South networks

The STUBE Programme offers:

- Weekend seminars, study days, excursions, courses during semester breaks, workshops and evening events on development-related topics
- Student leadership training for intercultural and country-specific assignments, for example in local schools and church congregations
- Support for students' personal development-related activities at the universities and the university communities
- Financial support for a development and career-orientated internship or research in the native country (BPSA).
- Transnational seminars in preparation for return to the native country and setting up a livelihood there
- Follow-up contact and alumni projects with former participants of the STUBE-programme
